Revesby's first Shopping Centre will house a 4,500m<sup>2</sup> Coles supermarket, speciality retail stores, large medical precinct and a state of the art AMF Bowling Centre all serviced by 275 basement car spaces.

The newly-opened Revesby Village Centre is a \$41 million dollar investment and one of the largest developments of its kind for a club in Australia.

What was once the outdoor parking area at the Brett St entrance of the club underwent a dramatic transformation into what is now a multi-level retail precinct that caters to a rapidly growing demographic.

Stage one boasts a 4,500m<sup>2</sup> flagship Coles supermarket and Liquorland, approximately 526m<sup>2</sup> of specialty retail, all serviced by 230 basement car spaces over two levels. Stage two includes an entire level dedicated to family entertainment with an AMF Bowling Centre and Carnival Kingdom children's play centre and café. Stage three is

a 3,244m<sup>2</sup> medical precinct, with up to 50 specialist consultants, day surgery facilities and ancillary services.

The precinct will greatly help solve the need for quality retail, medical and entertainment services in the area.

Club CEO Ed Camilleri says Revesby Village Centre will perfectly compliment Revesby. "This commercial precinct has proven to be a huge asset for the community by providing hundreds of new jobs. The precinct is also expected to attract well over 25,000 visitors each week."

Moves to build the retail hub were also underpinned by research showing the community landscape had changed dramatically and over 70 per cent of households were now families with young children.

"The new refurbishment forms part of the club's major diversification strategy allowing for facilities and services identified as either absent or insufficient during extensive research studies within the local community," says Camilleri.

"The club community has expressed great interest in the project and have been watching the development closely. They've supported the club every step of the way and are certainly excited to see the development completed."

One business opening as part of the new precinct is twotwo//onetwo cafe' which offers indoor and outdoor dining. Stylish in its presentation, the café has a contemporary industrial design with warm timbers and exposed bricks, cool metals and polished concrete finishes.
