

The \$50M Echuca Regional Health Redevelopment consists of partial demolition to the old Camray Wing in order to make room for a new Radiology Department, a Sub-Acute Unit, an Emergency Department and other needed medical and health facilities.

"The Echuca Regional Health Redevelopment is an example of our strength and capacity to undertake major construction activity that utilises the best resources in regional Victoria to deliver successful projects," said Jason Cox, Hansen Yuncken's Regional Manager. The Victorian Minister for Health, David Davis, marked the start of construction for the \$50 million redevelopment of the hospital by Hansen Yuncken in January 2013. The \$35 million first phase was completed in June 2014. The new modernised hospital will be fully operational in late 2015.

Hansen Yuncken has been working throughout regional VIC and southern NSW for almost 90 years. Echuca is situated on the Murray River, approximately 21/2 hours' drive north of Melbourne. The hospital admitted its first patient in 1882. Today it has approximately 600 staff and provides a range of services to over an estimated 44,000 people living in the Shire of Campaspe (VIC) and Murray Shire (NSW). "Our on-going commitment to commercial construction throughout

these regions separates our business from other larger construction companies," said Jason Cox.

The new hospital will provide 114 beds, 62 of which will be in single rooms with an ensuite. Included in the new hospital are a new state-ofthe-art Emergency Department and a 24 bed Rehabilitation Unit, with purposed-designed sanctuaries for palliative care patients. The new Surgical, Paediatric and Maternity Wards include a High Dependency Unit offering space and comfort for both patients and families. The new Maternity Ward provides for single rooms with a private ensuite for mothers and their newborn babies.

The redevelopment also includes a new Radiology Department, a new easily accessible front entry, reception and fover, a café, indigenous and spiritual spaces, relaxing and comfortable courtyards and gardens and an additional 78 car spaces for patients, visitors and staff. "A project of this size and nature has many daily challenges which were encountered throughout the first stage of works," said Jason Cox. "The services tie-ins between old and new, the installation of a complete new power supply, the upgrade of the fire service (without impacting the operation of the existing), working alongside a fully operational operating facility, were daily occurrences that were managed by our team."

During the works, Hansen Yuncken encountered significant amounts of hazardous material which required removal from alongside the operational inpatients accommodation. The staging of the works necessitated that Hansen Yuncken maintain three worksites across the facility without interrupting patient and staff access/egress, and hospital deliveries. "The ability of the project team to continually work across three sites within the existing hospital facility for 15 months, without interrupting the daily operations is a fantastic achievement," said Jason Cox.

A key feature of the redevelopment project is the inclusion of environmentally sustainable initiatives. Hansen Yuncken conducted numerous co-ordination meetings to manage the new technology required for a complete new 750kw solar field, an example of such initiatives. It will play an integral role in minimising the running costs of the entire hospital's energy use. As the solar field heats up, it

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produces hot water which is transferred into an absorption chiller. The absorption chiller uses the captured heat/energy to produce power which in turn provides an additional source of energy to run the air conditioning system of the hospital.

Some innovative products were also employed in the project. The mechanical services system, for example, utilises a prefabricated insulated form of ductwork that provides a cleaner and more efficient duct solution. This system required extremely detailed shop drawings to be prepared as the duct was fabricated interstate and had a 30 day lead time.

Hansen Yuncken currently has in excess of \$2.5b of health projects underway across Australia. The company was also awarded a second major regional Victorian health project; the \$50m Albury Wodonga Regional Cancer Center. Hansen Yuncken is also currently undertaking the \$170m Wagga Wagga Hospital Redevelopment. This work is complementing the major \$1.85b Royal Adelaide Hospital project and the \$130m Eye and Ear Redevelopment in Melbourne.


