

The 120 bed Mercy Place Fernhill Aged Care Facility boasts five levels of accommodation which provide a range of well-being features, including catering for couples and single residents with changing care needs.

The recent redevelopment of Mercy Place Fernhill Aged Care Facility will enhance quality of life for its residents by better servicing individual needs. Award winning Kane Constructions successfully delivered the new purpose built facility with their usual professionalism.

Located in the Victorian bayside suburb of Sandringham, the substantially redeveloped Mercy Place Fernhill Aged Care Facility consists of two basement levels and four residential levels. Expanding from 46 to 120 beds, Mercy Place Fernhill will accommodate singles and couples with changing care requirements. Owned and operated by the larger Mercy Health Group, the redevelopment is critical to the organization's goal of extending their aged care services to a wider clientele.

Kane Constructions managed the redevelopment of Mercy Place Fernhill. A privately owned commercial construction company with over 1600 successfully completed projects, Kane brought considerable experience to their role as head contractor. Besides managing all the subcontractors, Kane applied their impeccable professionalism to ensure the challenges of working in a confined suburban environment were overcome with minimal disruption to neighbouring residents.

Sam Birdseye, Project Manager at Kane, describes the Mercy Place Fernhill site as "landlocked". One main challenge of the redevelopment was the extremely tight access on the narrow residential street. Highly organized, controlled deliveries were required to negotiate the limited space. Sam credits Kane's "tight scheduling in terms of deliveries and hoisting" as one way the company "minimized disruption on the street."

Kane played an important role in keeping lines of communication open with other Fernhill Road residents. A sensitive location featuring another aged care facility, a church, school, and private residences, Kane remained respectful of residents' needs throughout the project's duration. "We liaised closely with the neighbours to keep them informed of construction

activities on site and future disruptions to ensure they were well informed and understood site activities," Sam explains.

With long-established and proven management systems, Kane Constructions are more than equipped to deal with any situation a project may present. Forward planning was key to successfully negotiating another challenge facing Kane at the outset. When Kane was awarded the project, there was a tender option for a fourth floor that didn't yet have planning approval. Construction commenced without Kane knowing if the additional floor was to go ahead, and the third floor was built by the time approval for the fourth was granted.

Once approval came through, work continued without interruption. The smooth continuation of construction was down to Kane working closely with the architect and consultants, and planning in advance to ensure everything was place.

Founded in 1973, Kane has achieved steady and sustainable growth with a current turnover in excess of \$450m and more than 250 full time employees. Kane operate across all sectors of the industry along the east coast of Australia and overseas, from Melbourne, Sydney, and Brisbane offices.

The company boasts a strong balance sheet, no debt, and total assets exceeding \$150m. A security facility caters for over \$1 billion of work currently under construction. Kane attribute their success to a vibrant culture, professionalism, competence, integrity, and enjoyment in their work.

This involved the construction of pad footings, the laying of the ground and ramp slabs of the lower basement, and detailed excavation at the basement level. Slabs were constructed at the lower ground floor, while suspended slabs for higher floors were constructed on conventional form, in addition to stairs. On any given day, a team of 30-40 concreters, form workers, and steel fixers were onsite, coordinated by foreman Mick Taylor.

While its bayside location offers the residents of Mercy Place Fernhill all the suburban conveniences, from a construction point of view, a confined residential area presents a particular set of challenges. Experience counts in these situations, and having previously completed a number of projects with similarly tight parameters, Solcrete were more than equipped to resolve any challenges swiftly and effectively.

In particular, as Solcrete Director Paul Bassford notes, one such challenge the company successfully negotiated in the reconstruction of Mercy Place Fernhill Aged Care Facility, was the co-ordination of deliveries and staff working from multiple site fronts that could have impeded progress. The constraints of the physical site were only matched by the timeframe of the project. Paul says that "meeting building milestone deadlines within the six month building program" was another challenge at Mercy Place Fernhill.

In such a restricted environment, adhering to OH&S requirements becomes a top priority for Solcrete. "It can compromise safety if workers cut corners to achieve milestones," Paul explains.

Solcrete are dedicated to workplace safety, and consistently ensure their trained staff is OH&S compliant. Workers have completed courses in Applied First Aid, Electrical Spotting, Building Project Management

Training, and Elevated Platform/Scissor Lift Operations and Safety. The company also utilizes the latest 3D modelling programs for structural packages that guarantees accurate takeoffs of materials and eliminates wastage.

Solcrete are as equally committed to the health of the environment, and take pride in their best practice environmental management system. Strategies include undertaking risk assessments and risk management of sites, dust control, minimizing the onsite storage of chemicals and fuels, and responsible waste management.
